Celebration Time!

As last year's Year 6 children settle into their new secondary schools, we would like to share their impressive SATs exam results and end of primary assessments with you.

90% of the class reached the expected standard in maths, compared to the national average of 75%. Similarly, in reading, 90% reached the expected standard in reading, compared to the national average of 71%. In writing they also excelled with 87% reaching the expected standard, compared to the national average of 76%. As well as being delighted with these results, we were equally proud of how the children tackled these assessments with confidence and a 'can do' attitude.

I am sure you will join me in thanking Mrs Miller and her team for going the extra mile to support the children in every way. Thanks to, to all the teaching staff who have played their part along the way.

Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium is funding allocated to schools to help provide the very best outcomes for children from low income families. This funding can be used to subsidise uniforms, trips and music lessons, as well as helping provide additional support as and when needed. Previously the allocation of Pupil Premium was based on families who qualified for free school meals, however, with the introduction of free meals for all children in reception and Key Stage 1, this entitlement has become somewhat masked.
