


Weekly Wows


Year 4 produced these wonderful patterns in their art lessons this week, using a compass.

Forest School

* Remote Learning *

Quite a few children were unable to come into school this week as they were self-isolating as they waited for a Covid test for either themselves or a household member. It is more than likely that this is going to be an ongoing scenario for the foreseeable future.

We need to make sure that children who are unable to be in school continue to access learning at home so they don't fall behind.

From next week, each teacher will, therefore, be planning a timetable of learning activities for each day, linked to what children in class will be doing. This will include resources that will be used in class as well as links to high quality external resources such as Oak Academy and White Rose. This will be posted on the ClassDojo page.

Our expectation is that children who are well enough should be doing as close to a full day's work at home as they can. We appreciate that younger children will need more support from an adult at home and that the ability to provide this will vary due to each family's circumstances, but the Department for Education has made very clear that this should be the aim.

We will shortly be sending out a survey to all parents across the Trust schools to see who may need a laptop or support with internet access if they are learning remotely. Meanwhile, if your child is working at home and they do not have a device bigger than a phone to support them, let me know and we will do our best to arrange for a laptop for them to have at home.

If a whole class or bubble has to self-isolate, then we will have a more comprehensive remote learning offer, similar to during lockdown last term.
