Homework tasks will continue to include TTRS, daily reading, precision times tables, knowledge organisers and alternative maths/SPaG tasks. Please can I stress the importance of reading with your child at home. It is really important that they read daily for 10 - 15 minutes as this will not only help improve their fluency and comprehension but also aid them in accessing all areas of the curriculum. The children will continue to take a Star Reader quiz at the beginning of each half-term to track and assess their reading levels. Please can I ask that children bring their AR books to school every day along with their yellow reading logs.
