Her dedication and care for the children, as well as her skills and expertise, have made a real difference in the lives of many children. While we are sad to see her go, we know that the skills she has developed here will serve her well in her new role.

Mrs Cannon has been an invaluable member of our school community for more than 15 years, working as a Learning Support Assistant (LSA) and providing class cover when needed. While we are saddened by her departure, we are also excited for her as she embarks on this new chapter by trying something different. We wish her all the very best in her new role and know she will continue to be amazing wherever she goes. We want to extend our heartfelt thanks to Mrs Newstead and Mrs Cannon for all their hard work and commitment to Kedington, and we wish them every success as they embark on this new adventure. Attendance - Persistent Absence

We have noticed an increase in our Persistent Absence (PA) figures, largely due to holidays being taken during term time. To clarify, "PA" refers to children who miss 10% or more of school days, which can significantly impact their learning and progress. While we understand the importance of family time, we encourage parents to consider taking holidays during school breaks to avoid the impact of missed lessons. Please see our Trust Attendance Policy on the school website for further information.

I also wanted to share with you some information from Suffolk regarding FPN and how holiday fines are used. I can confirm that school does not financially benefit from the local authority issuing fines. Please see information below from Suffolk:

The Use of FPN Funds Monies collected are used for administration of the penalty notice system and prosecutions. Any surplus left after this is spent on attendance support. This revenue is not considered part of wider local authority funding and is not used to fund the core attendance expectations. Examples of how surplus this year has been spent:

- Supporting case work which allows us to keep the costs to school as low as possible.
- Access to Educational Psychologist for EWO's with challenging cases.
- Bikes, bus passes and other transport for pupils in emergency accommodation to allow them to remain on role at their current school.
- Mental health toolkit training for EWO's
- An Attendance outreach project with rural schools

Smartphone Free Childhood Initiative

We are delighted with the positive response to this initiative. Several parents have messaged us to thank us for helping them to say no to their child having a smartphone and visitors to our recent Open Morning commented that this was a deciding factor in choosing Kedington as the first choice for their child.

The pledge can be made at any time and is not binding until we have at least ten pledges in a class. We have already reached this milestone in Year 1 and Year 2 and are only one away in Year 3!
